### GOURMET RECIPES

### Dryfruit Halwa

### INGREDIENTS:

Cashew nuts, Walnuts, Almonds and Pistachios - 100gms. each (coarsely ground)

Milk - 1 glass

Sugar - 300 gms.

Khoya - 400 gms.

Black raisins - 50 gms.

Ghee or oil - 1 cup

Cardamoms - 2 (ground)

### METHOD:

- 1. Heat the ghee and fry the Khoya stirring all the time till it turns light brown. Keep aside.
- 2. Boil the milk and add the sugar. Stir till the sugar dissolves.
- 3. Remove from heat and mix well with the Khoya. Add the dry fruits, raisins and the ground cardamoms powder and mix well.
- 4. Spoon the mixture into a greased plate and smoothen with a flat spoon.
- 5. Cut into diamond shaped pieces and garnish with almonds and pistachios.
